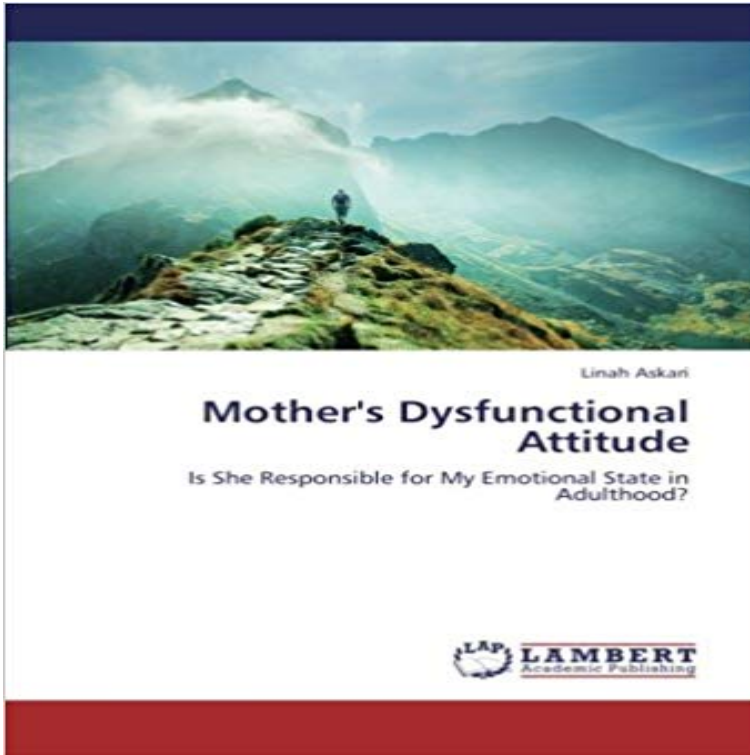


# Mothers Dysfunctional Attitude: Is She Responsible for My Emotional State in Adulthood?
